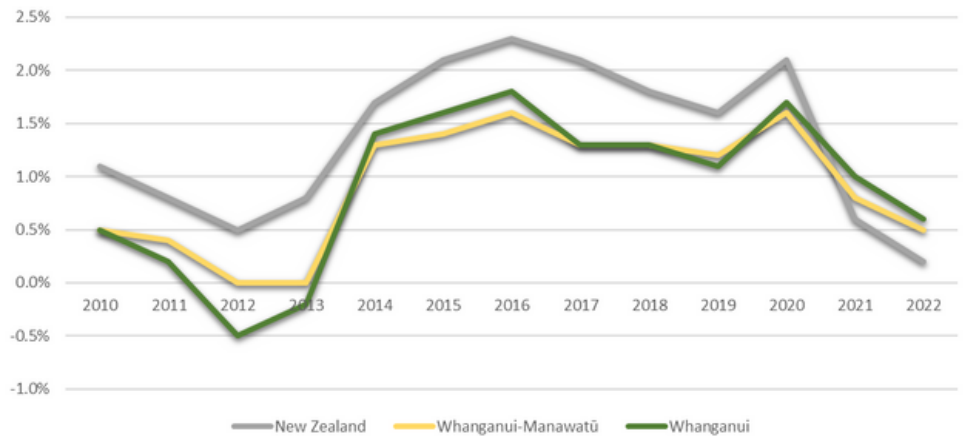

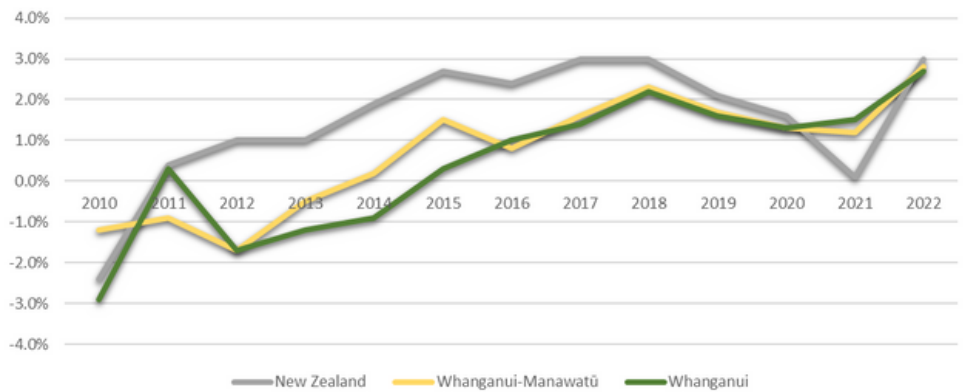
## ► Population Growth (2022)

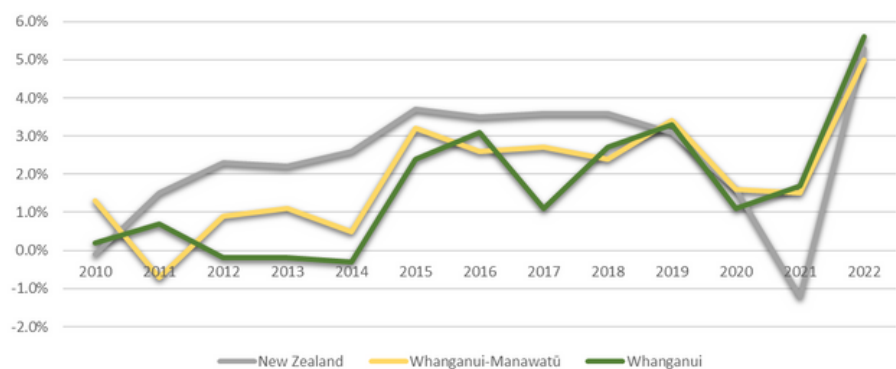
## ► Job Growth (2022)
