



Creativity, innovative spirit, cultural integrity and strength of artistic tradition have won Whanganui recognition as an internationally significant UNESCO City of Design.

This globally recognised and respected status elevates Whanganui's products and connects it to UNESCO's global Creative Cities Network.

The designation enables Whanganui to attract investment, skilled labour, innovation and development of new markets.

The designation earns Whanganui a place in the UNESCO Creative Cities Network and recognises the city's historic and contemporary contributions to design in innumerable and varied forms.





Leading both economic and social development

Whanganui has earned international recognition as a leading model for economic and social development.

In 2023, Whanganui was named a Smart21 City by America-based think tank the Intelligent Community Forum. Whanganui has been awarded the status for the past eight years and is the only New Zealandcitiy to retain its place on the list.

Smart21 cities are recognised across six key catagories; digital connection, opportunites for workers of the future, innovation and development of new technology, engaged communities, and sustainability.
